Directions:

1. Start a new ArcGIS Explorer Map
2. Save it as "World Literature"
3. Create 5 points on the globe that show where this week's stories were written. Make each point a different symbol.
4. In the point attributes, record the following for each story:
 - Title of Story
 - Author of Story
 - Name of the place where it was written
 - Date it was written
 - One or two sentences describing the main idea of the story
5. Next, using the same symbols for each story that you used in step 3, place points on the map that show the setting of each story
 - Is the setting of the story the same as where the story was written?
6. Using ArcGIS Explorer, create a presentation that has a slide for each point. Be sure to label each slide with what is being shown. Present this to your teacher/family/parent.

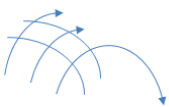
